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THANKSGIVING - NOT A COMMON TRAIT!

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One of the most pathetic cases of ingratitude is seen in Jesus' healing of the ten lepers - only one of them came back to thank Him for such a tremendous blessing. He obviously was disappointed for he said, "**Where are the nine?**" It hardly seems possible that they could be so hard hearted and self-centered, but over the years, we have seen some things to rival it. I was just a youngster during the Great Depression years. I can remember the long "bread lines" and the WPA workers standing on the street corners doing very little work. During those desperate times, there was a radio personality who had a program called "Job Center of the Air." He did his best to find jobs for those in need and in fact, he did find jobs for 2,500 people in days when jobs were as "scarce as hen's teeth." He reported that out of that large number who received assistance, only ten ever took the time to thank him. Can you believe that? What base ingratitude! I also read of a man who remembered a school teacher who had been very helpful to him when he was a child. So, he sat down and wrote her a letter expressing his thankfulness to her. She was now in her eighties and living all alone. Upon receiving his letter she wrote to him: "I can't tell you how much your letter meant to me. You will be interested to know that I taught school for fifty years, and yours is the first note of appreciation that I have ever received. It came on a blue, cold morning and it filled me with cheer."

Ingratitude is indeed a base sin. God says, "**Be ye thankful!**" The Bible says that in the last days, "**...men shall be lovers of their own selves.**" Now, that has always been true, for man is basically selfish...self is the essence of sin. But it is increasing and intensifying like all other sins in these last days. Unfortunately, this sin like many others is becoming more and more evident in professing Christians. Thanksgiving Day for most professed believers in Jesus Christ is nothing more than a holiday, a time of feasting, ballgames, etc. They hardly even think about God and they certainly do not have time to go to Church. We don't expect anything of the world, but God's people ought to take this time to express their thanksgiving to God for His salvation and provision. The first Thanksgiving, held in 1621 at Plymouth, Mass. was a time of gratitude to God after a very tough voyage, a hard winter, and the death of exactly half of those who had set out. How grateful are you for God's blessing and bounty? How grateful for that "**unspeakable gift.**" Are you thankful enough to surrender your all to "**Him who loved us and gave himself for us.**"? In spite of the sad condition of our land today, how blessed of God we are! In his Thanksgiving Proclamation, in the midst of that horrible war, Abraham Lincoln said: "We have been the recipients of the choicest bounties of Heaven...But we have forgotten God..." If we are true believers in Jesus Christ, our gratitude ought to be abundantly evident. "**Oh, that men would praise the Lord for his goodness, and for his wonderful works to the children of men.**" ~Psalm 107:8, 15, 21, 31. Those words appear four times in one Psalm. I think God expects us to be thankful! Lord, forgive us for our ingratitude.

POLICING A DRESS CODE!

Peyton Manning was prevented from wearing high-top shoes. The fine is \$5,000 for the first offense, \$10,000 for the second. Basketball players have had to give up their skimpy shorts and have gone to baggy ones. Now the baggy look is being scrutinized. My question is: If popular and highly paid professional athletes have an enforced dress code, what's wrong with doing the same with our school children (or for church)? Christian schools are caving in on dress code, many of them looking like hoodlums, when our bunch should set the example. Often now it is the same in church on Sunday. Funerals are about the only thing left for which some people look nice. In another article Pyle referred to Paul Harvey's statement while on the Larry King show. Asked why he always dressed up in tie and coat Harvey said, businessmen know that the way we dress does matter. "When we tried casual dress, things were not the same. When we went 'casual' we lost something." Harvey also referred to the way many students dress like bums. Pyle also noted that Bay County schools in Florida announced a new school dress code and said it will be enforced. They will be "watching carefully for skimpy clothes on girls and saggy jeans on boys." "Revealing garb" will no longer be tolerated. They're going to measure short shorts and other "attention-grabbing clothes." "Dresses must cover what they're supposed to cover." Ed. Isn't it strange there are worldly who people can see what some Christians can't see - or, don't want to see!

"There are many who dare not smite with the hand, who are very busy laying on their tongue, and this not by exposing our errors, which they have a perfect right to do, but in many cases the children of God are misrepresented, slandered, abused, persecuted, ridiculed for the truth's sake...anything to drive the servants of God from their integrity and from their simple following of their Master. Do not expect men to be friends of your piety...Thou must expect sometimes to be bullied and sometimes coerced, to be sometimes flattered, and anon, threatened; thou must expect at one time to be met with the oily tongue which hath tinder (in) it, the drawn sword... Look out, and expect that men will be against you...I do not know that it is of any great service to have numbers with you. I question whether truth has not generally to be with the minority, and whether it is not quite as honorable to serve God with two or three as it would be with two or three million. Never judge according to numbers, say they are nothing but men after all...Be a friend to the truth; make your appeal to the law and to the testimony...When Latimer preached before Henry VIII, he had greatly displeased His Majesty...and was ordered to preach the following Sabbath and to make an apology. After reading his text, he began--'Hugh Latimer, dost thou know before whom thou art to speak? To the high and mighty monarch, the king's most excellent majesty, who can take away thy life if thou offendest; therefore take heed that thou speakest not a word that may displease; consider well, Hugh, dost thou not know whence thou comest; upon whose message thou art sent? Even by the great and mighty God who is all-present...' He then proceeded with the same sermon he had preached the previous Sabbath, only with much more energy.
