

VICTORY OVER SELF! November 2004

This article was suggested to me through a message by A.B. Simpson, written about 100 years ago. No Christian is going to go anywhere spiritually until he gets victory over the Self-life! And sad to say, the truth is, not too many get the victory. The Self-life has many forms: the first being Self-Will. Until this giant of evil is slain there will be no true spirituality. It is the sin of Satan - Isaiah 14, etc. It is all too prevalent among the people of God. I must have my own way, or else... Self-Indulgence is the gratification of self! Eating, drinking, dress and other desires are not wrong in themselves. But I am not to eat, drink, dress, etc. just to gratify my fleshly desires. God says, "Whether therefore ye eat and drink or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God." All is to be done to this end, that is, to please God, not myself. See Colossians 3:17. Self-Seeking is another common sin among God's people. In this case, self is really served though ostensibly one is serving God. Love "...seeketh not her own..." The believer's goal is to "...seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness..." Though rarely recognized, Self-Pity is one of the most common and worst of the Self sins. This is a most debilitating sin, it feeds on itself. There are many cases in the Bible; one example is poor Asaph, Psalm 73. Of course, if you don't join in the pity party, you are not loving. Self-Confidence is relying on one's own wisdom, strength or ability though lip service may be given to God. One can see this in Peter's boasting he would not deny the Lord. Such individuals have to fall, like Peter, before they come to the end of self! This is nothing more than laboring in the flesh. Unfortunately, there is too much of this in the Lord's work. Self-Importance has its share of followers. True humility is not necessarily thinking meanly of oneself, but not thinking of ourselves at all. One outstanding example is Diotrephes. I remember many years ago a lady who always came to service late and strutted down the center aisle, getting what she supposed was proper attention.

Self-Vindication, a most common sin, is quick to stand up for its own rights and usually seeks to avenge its wrongs. There is a proper time to defend one's actions or situation, but these are few. Mostly, this is condemned in Scripture and is contrary to the spirit of Christ. It is said of Him: "He humbled himself and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross." And "When he was reviled, he reviled not again." Another Self-Sin seen among God's people is Sensitiveness. Dr. Simpson said, "I have seen Christians who had been all bright and radiant for a time, but something touched them that was offensive, uncongenial, humbling and they became like Egyptian mummies." The Bible says, "Great peace have they that love thy law, and nothing shall offend them." Self-Love is really the root of all forms of the Self-Life. How often I have heard, "The Church isn't loving." What this person really means is that the people don't appreciate me, they do not love me as they should. Dr. Simpson said, "Love that terminates in ourselves is selfish and degrading." Read I Corinthians 13; true love is outgoing. We are to love others - even if they don't love us!

**Self-Motives** are to be strenuously refused. Only in the Spirit can we do this. The flesh (**Self-Life**) cannot please God - *see Romans 8:8*. The old man in each of us wants some credit, some glory, some recognition. (*Cont'd p. 3*)

# **NEWS YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT**

Then, we all need to beware of **Selfish Possessions**. When we see the Scriptures aright, we learn that we are but stewards and all that we have and are belongs to God. The first Christians saw this: "**Neither said any of them that ought of the things that they possessed were their own.**" What God has allowed us to have is to be held in trust for Him and His work! Though there are others, we will end with this one, **Selfish Prayers**. This is a most serious problem! Listen to the Scriptures:"...ye have not, because ye ask not. Ye ask, and receive not, because ye ask amiss, that ye may consume it upon your lusts." ~James 4:2,3. The highest form of prayer is not for oneself, but for others (though we have legitimate needs and should pray for ourselves).

My Christian friend, did any of these Self-Sins strike you? I imagine one or more did! None of us is totally without blame in this area. One must be blind not to see that much of what is done in the name of the Lord is done in the flesh and to please the individual. God says, "So, then they that are in the flesh cannot please God." If you are guilty in any of these areas, get alone with God and give YOURSELF up to Him and His Word. The essence of the Christian life is "not I but Christ." There is no real joy, nothing of real value, and nothing eternal which is done in the flesh. If you are guilty in one or more of these areas, don't sulk or get angry, that is only evidence of a serious Self problem. Confess your sin and ask God to help you get victory over it! Make a heartfelt commitment: "I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; vet not I, but Christ liveth in me and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me." ~Galatians 2:20

## **APA ENDORSES HOMOSEXUAL MARRIAGE!**

According to *Religion Today* (8/6/04), the American Psychological Association has endorsed homosexual "marriage." The APA president Diane Halpern (don't men run anything today?) said the organization will adopt a policy supporting it because, as she said, "Keeping gays from marrying puts a particular stress on them because of their sexual orientation." This is just one more evidence which shows these people do not know what it's all about. How can you possibly help someone by catering to their perverted life style?

TRUTH - ROMAN CATHOLIC VERSION! A highranking Vatican official is giving Roman Catholics some leeway in supporting politicians who support abortion. The Washington Post reports that Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger, the Vatican's arbiter of doctrinal orthodoxy, has written to U.S. Catholic leaders when a Catholic can vote for a candidate - even when that candidate supports abortion. If a voter has other compelling reasons to vote for a pro-abortion candidate, such as agreeing with his economic policies, then such a choice is acceptable. For example, a voter may oppose John Kerry's abortion stand, but still vote for Kerry because that person supports the Democratic economic policy or his criticism of President Bush's stand on Iraq. Earlier this summer, Archbishop Burke of St. Louis said a Catholic who votes for someone like Kerry is committing a "grave sin." Burke has now clarified that remark to reflect Ratzinger's directive. - Religion Today (9/14/04). Ed. What duplicity and hypocrisy! The Catholic Church always finds a way to do that which is expedient. Baby murder is OK if a man's economic policy suits you! What deceit!

FALWELL'S WORSHIP LEADER LEARNS AT LAS VEGAS. Rev. Ray Rodgers, Jr. (Lynchburg, June 27) sent us a copy of his letter to the *Forum* about Charles Billingsley (Thomas Road Baptist Church's music "worship leader") going to Las Vegas to learn from "a quintessential showman (Wayne Newton) how to make an audience - or congregation - come alive." The Wayne Newton Theater at the Stardust Hotel is one of the classrooms where singer Billingsley has sat trying to learn from Newton. He says, "I sit there with a note pad, noting how many songs he sings, where he takes a break, how long he talks between..." The article said Billingsley "loves it when the crowd is rocking." -CC (8/04). This is not surprising considering all the other compromises and worldly programs Falwell has been involved in. It only goes to prove what we have often said, compromise is a one way street, all downhill, and unless there is repentance (which is rare), it can only end in total apostasy. It's also been said, "What you win them with is what you win them to." You cannot have spiritual people with a compromising, worldly program.

## ONE THING INDISPENSABLE!

If someone were to ask me what is the most important thing we need among God's people today, I would say the power of the Holy Spirit. I am talking about those who are truly saved, churches that are Bible believing and Fundamental. We have many programs, schemes, and organization, but where is the power of God today? There is no power in the church without the working of the Holy Spirit. Jesus said, "Ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you..." Listen to what Charles Haddon Spurgeon said about the necessity of Spirit-filled living (and preaching). He said, "If we do not have the Spirit of God it is better to shut the churches, to nail up the doors, to put a black cross on them and say, 'God have mercy on us.' If our ministers have not the Spirit of God you had better not preach and you people had better stay at home. I think I speak not too strongly when I say that a church in the land without the Spirit of God is rather a curse than a blessing. If you have not the Spirit of God, Christian worker, remember that you stand in somebody else's way..." D.L. Moody said, "Get this power (the Holy Spirit), and you will do more good in a week than you could do without it in many years." We are told in Ephesians 5:18: "Be ye filled with the Spirit." There is no such thing as being half filled or three-quarters filled! I believe it was Tozer who said something to the effect that if the Holy Spirit were secretly withdrawn from the church, there would be very few among God's people who would notice it.

I remember seeing many years ago, a "Peanuts" cartoon. A very dejected Charlie Brown was walking along dragging his baseball bat behind him. He was saying, "Good grief; one hundred and eighty-four to nothing! How can we lose when we are so sincere?" You see, what really counts is winning! Nice, sincere people lose all the time. Sincerity cannot give you what is lacking. Sincerity cannot make you well if you are sick. Sincerity cannot turn wrong into right. Sincerity cannot erase your sins. If you are on the wrong road, sincerity cannot bring you out to the right place. God says, "There is a way that seemeth right unto a man, but the end thereof are the ways of death." If you are ever going to be saved from your sins, you will have to be sincere - but you will also have to be right! In Matthew 7:13,14 the Bible says, there is a broad road (where everyone may do and believe as he wishes) but it leads to destruction. There is also a narrow road which leads unto life. The way to God is narrow and very specific. Jesus said, "I am the way (road), the truth and the life, no man cometh unto the Father but by me." If salvation was by sincerity, it would mean you could save yourself. The Bible is clear: "Not by works...which we have done but according to his mercy has he saved us..." Be sincere, but also be right! "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ and thou shalt be saved."
