**LORD, GIVE US MEN LIKE THIS!**

J. Allen Blair told of an incident that took place in his life many years ago while he was pastoring in Minnesota. A man from New York by the name of Swanson, who owned a baking company, wrote to Dr. Blair asking if could meet him in the railroad station in Chicago where there was to be a baker's convention. The purpose was to see if Dr. Blair would consider coming to pastor a Church in New York. They had never met before and the man described himself. Upon their meeting in the crowded station Mr. Swanson said, "Let us thank God!" He immediately closed his eyes and began pouring his heart out to God. He prayed on; I thought he'd never end said Dr. Blair. "It was only a matter of a few minutes but it seemed like a half hour. I peeked out of one eye and people were looking and wondering what was going on. This mattered not to Mr. Swanson. He was totally oblivious to everyone else. It was as though only two were there - God and himself! What boldness, what concern, what earnestness of prayer." He went on to say that immediately I was drawn to this saint of God for here was a man who knew how to reach into the heavenly places. The Lord led Dr. Blair to the Church where Mr. Swanson was a board member. He testified: "Mr. Swanson was a constant companion and source of encouragement. Frequently I would hear his knock on my door about eight or eight-thirty in the morning. He would come in and say, 'May we pray?' Immediately we would go to our knees. He would commit me and my work for the day to the Lord and I would likewise pray for him. He would go out praising the Lord! What a joy this brought to my heart, what strength and encouragement as I faced the burdens and discouragements of the pastorate." Then, Dr. Blair went on to say to those before him: "I wonder what kind of a man you are in your church. As your Pastor looks into your face on the Lord's day, can he say, 'Thank God for that man, he is the one who helps lift me into the presence of God?'"

A song that I only recently heard for the first time was sung by our male quartet; it is entitled, "*Lord, Make Me A Faithful Man.*" I really like that song! Not everyone can preach, etc. but everyone can be faithful! Believe me Christian, God expects you to be faithful. Now, in the many years of my ministry, I can say thank God for some faithful men. But I will be honest - over the long haul - they have been few. I think any Pastor would tell you the same thing. There are many who will "love" and "support" you as long as you do not take a stand which goes against their own personal desires or beliefs. There are some who have been "fair weather" friends, but when things really get rough or stormy, and unpopular decisions have to be made, they will shift their allegiance to the unspiritual majority or the vocal minority. This is not a complaint - merely the truth. Of course, it is my responsibility to do and say the right thing regardless of what others may say or do. Often the man of God must stand alone like Joseph, Moses, Elijah, Jeremiah, Paul, etc. But I will echo the words of Dr. Blair; there are few things more helpful in the work of the Lord than having men that you can count upon - especially in the matter of holding you before the Throne of Grace. I am convinced if we had more men in our churches like this, we would see a wonderful moving of the Holy Spirit. **"The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much."**

## NEWS YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT

### **MOST EVANGELICALS BELIEVE GOOD PEOPLE GO TO HEAVEN.**

The majority of Protestants and Evangelicals believe that good people and people of other religions go to Heaven according to author David Campbell. Campbell...contends that the survey of 3,000 Americans shows that... good people despite their religious affiliation can go to Heaven. Among the faiths, 83 percent of evangelical Protestants agreed that good people of other faiths can go to Heaven. When prodded further, more than half – 54% of evangelical Protestants said, yes, people of other religions can go to Heaven... -ChristianPost.com.

### **ORTHODOX LEADER CHIDES FAITHFUL OVER SLOPPY DRESS.**

A top official of the Russian Orthodox Church has called for an official dress code to encourage propriety after suggesting that provocatively dressed women provoke immorality and violence. “Vulgar external appearance and vulgar behavior is a straight path to misery,” Archpriest Vsevolod Chaplin said in an open letter, [Religion News Service](#) reports. “To empty ‘one-night stands.’ To short marriages followed by rat-like divorces. To children with broken fates. To loneliness and madness. To catastrophes in life.” Chaplin, a top aide to Patriarch Kirill, proposed a “Russia-wide dress code,” saying it should apply to men as well. Critics accused Chaplin of “replacing public discourse on the problem of violence against women with discussion of their external appearance.”-*Religion News Service* (1/21/11). Ed. We have lost more people over a dress code than any other reason. Yet here is a Russian Orthodox statement about the need for a dress code. I have personally seen dress codes posted in restaurants and in prisons. One prison dress code states in so many words that sensual dress causes problems Indeed it does! God has said that women are to dress “modestly” that is, *appropriately*. While it is not mentioned, God surely expects men to dress modestly also. The Word also says, **“Let all things be done decently and in order.”** ~1 *Corinthians 14:40* However, knowing human nature, the greatest problem is with women who, as one preacher stated, “show too much flesh.” Christian, God does care how you dress. God says, **“Be not conformed to this world but be ye transformed...”**

### **TRINITY SPEAKER PASSIONATE ABOUT CHRISTIAN ROCK**

Trinity Baptist College’s annual Church Life Student Conference is featuring a speaker who is passionate about Christian rock. On his web site, Tony Nolan says he is “an outspoken advocate of Contemporary Christian Music” and “partners regularly in concert and conferences with rockers such as Third Day, Reliant K, SuperTones, Pillar, Skillet, Delirious, and Toby Mac. Nolan also has a great admiration for Billy Graham, the grand master of spiritual compromise and ecumenical evangelism. In his blog for October 8, 2010, Nolan described a recent visit with Graham and George Beverly Shea. Trinity Baptist of Jacksonville, Florida, was once a conservative school that practiced separation from the world, but under the direction of Tom Messer this has changed dramatically. ### **OHIO UNIV. OFFERS GENDER-NEUTRAL DORMS.**

Ohio University will allow male, female, gay and straight students to cohabitate in the same room during a one-year trial of gender-neutral dorms. Starting in the fall, the state university will become the 56<sup>th</sup> university in America to offer the chance to live in gender-neutral housing. Other schools such as Princeton University, Columbia University and George Washington University also have gender-neutral living quarters. This means that students can live in the same room with any student regardless of sex, gender, gender identity/expression, or sexual orientation, the university website states. -*Christian Post*. Ed. This tells you a whole lot about where America is going. However, it is only one of many on-going practices that is absolutely degrading. One wonders when the Lord is going to judge this land.

### **THE DESTRUCTION OF MARRIAGE IN U.S.**

Back in November of 1898 the steamship Portland left Boston Harbor in the midst of a severe storm. Though all the signals for danger were flying the ship left port, even though the government agent at the signal office had strongly advised the outgoing vessel to remain in port. She left in spite of the fact that the ship's owners had commanded her to remain in the dock. Why she left, no one has ever been able to discover. Her captain must have been apprehensive, for he sent a message to the lighthouse keeper saying, "Keep your light burning for we may come back." The vessel no sooner got outside the harbor when the fierce storm caught her in its embrace and tore her to pieces. No one on board ever again saw home or friends. How many lives have been shipwrecked for disobeying the commands of God! God has a plan for every life; for your life. But that plan involves obedience to His Word. God says, "But this thing commanded I them, saying, **'Obey my voice and I will be your God, and ye shall be my people, and walk ye in all the ways that I have commanded you, that it may be well unto you.'**" ~*Jeremiah 7:23*.
